

What Do I Bring?

Basic Camping Supplies

- Tent, extra stakes, neon string, tikis/lanterns
- Bedding (sleeping bag, sheets, pillows, etc. - **it can get cold at night.**)
- Air mattress/cot, pump for air mattress (if bringing one), batteries for pump
- Camping chair
- Shovel, mallet/hammer
- Camp stove/cooking over open fire equipment & fuel (propane, charcoal, etc.)
- Pots & pans to cook with, cooking utensils
- Plates & bowls, cups, eating utensils
- Napkins/paper towels
- Wash basin, dish soap, scrubbie, towel for drying (**PLEASE NOTE** - because we are on a river, wash basins to keep the gray water from going into the ground are ESSENTIAL. We will have large tubs to empty gray water into that the camp owners will pump daily.)

Hygiene Products

- Soap, shampoo, conditioner, towels
- toothpaste, toothbrush
- Brush, comb, deodorant
- Feminine hygiene and/or shaving products as needed
- Any other hygiene products you would normally take on vacation

Medications

- Prescription Medication
- Over the Counter medications (advil, ect.)
- Sunblock, Aloe Vera/Sunburn Ointment
- Insect Repellent
- Personal First Aid Kit

Clothing

- Clothes - while this is a pagan festival, because we are on a campground with mundanes, you **MUST** be dressed appropriately when heading up to the shower house, pool, river, or camp store. As well, the temperature has been known to range between 80 (mid-day) and 40 (night), so we suggest bringing clothes you can layer as the temperature changes.
- Swimsuit - there IS a pool on site, and we also have a river.
- Ritual attire (and ritual gear)

Other Suggested Items

- Camera - with batteries and SD card
- Pens & Notebook
- Drums, Guitar
- Reusable water bottle - hydration is important during summer while outside!
- Card table
